Death was the result of burns caused by collision in the air. While flying in "Combat manoeuvres" with the 7th Squadron Royal Flying Corps, he was run into from the rear; the planes locked and burst into flames: though 2000 feet up and in the midst of the flames he had the presence of mind and the courage to make what would otherwise be called a good landing; both planes were totally destroyed and he was so terribly burned that he died soon after.
