Minutes of the October 31, 2018 Meeting

The meeting of the Noyac Citizens Advisory Committee was called to order at 7:00 P.M. at the Old Noyac School House, Noyac Road, Noyac

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

It was noted the tree which fell on top of the waterfall at Trout Pond is still there and has not been removed.

There will be a public forum held by the Federal Aviation Administration on November 14, 2018 at the Riverhead Middle School, 600 Harrison Avenue, Riverhead, at 7:00 p.m. to discuss helicopter routes and noise impacts. While the FAA does not plan to make a presentation, all are encouraged to attend and let your voice be heard.

It was noted the Town Board did authorize the acquisition for open space purposes of 1.7 acres of vacant land on Noyac Road opposite Trout Pond. While a newspaper article stated the Town Board discussed possibly using the site for parking, the members felt it should be left as open land to preserve the views of Mill Creek.

The Secretary reported on a Town Board agenda item concerning the “extension of water mains to certain roads in the hamlet of Noyac.” Attempts to obtain more information proved fruitless and emails were read from the Supervisor’s office which referred the matter to the Town Attorney who advised they had no information but advised that the road in question was a Trustee road and that the Fire Marshal had more information. According to the Town Board minutes prepared after the hearing, the issue actually had to do with a fire cistern on Northview Drive which was unusable and that mains should be extended down said road for fire protection. A question was asked as to how the Town Board could hold a hearing and have no information for the public concerning same beforehand.

It was noted the parking area at Long Beach is gradually disintegrating. An email will be sent to the Parks Department to see if they can resolve that issue.

The latest concerning the Sand Land mining operation on the north side of Middle Line was discussed. A question was asked if the owner had filed an appeal or had closed down the mining operation or started reclamation as ordered by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation due to the groundwater contamination issue. The Secretary will inquire.

Restricting truck access on Noyac Road was briefly discussed.

A question was asked as to whether any action has been taken by the Town against the Ross School's use of residences on the east side of Millstone Road as dormitories. Councilman Tommy John Schiavoni will again be asked to look into this matter.

A question was asked as to who pays for the Town Police control at major private events such as the Hampton Classic or Hank's Pumpkin Farm.

There being no further business before the membership, the meeting was adjourned at 7:53 P.M.
