

EXTRACT FROM DEED OF FARRETT June 12 1640.

From Docs. of Col. Hist. of N.Y., V.3, p.21.

Know all men whom this present writing may concern that I, James Farret of Long Island Gent: Deputy to the right Honble the Earle of Stirling Secretarie for the kingdom of Scotland do by these presents in the name and behalf of the said Earle of Stirling and in my own name as doth or may concerne myself give up all Rights, Titles, Claims and Demands of and from all Patent Right of all those lands lying and being bounded between Peaconeck and the eastermost point of long Island with the whole breadth of the said Island from sea to sea with all lands and premises contained within the said limits . . . unto Edward Howell, Daniel How, Job Sayer and their associates . . . by vertue of my letters of Attorney bearing date 1637. In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seale the 12th of June 1640.
