Boyenton served in the 81st Regiment New York Volunteer Infantry, known as the “Mohawk Rangers,” in Company H.

In July 1862, at the age of 31, he mustered in with the rank of Private. He mustered out August 17, 1865, from the US General Hospital, at Fort Monroe, VA.
