## Samuel B. Dutcher

Hometown: Sag Harbor

Dutcher served in the 81st New York Volunteer Infantry was known as the "Mohawk Rangers," in Company H.

On January 10, 1862, at the age of 26, he mustered in with the rank of Private.

When Dutcher returned from service he served as a Sag Harbor Police Officer and Sheriff.

He is buried in Oakland Cemetery, Sag Harbor.
