## Henry L. Edwards

Hometown: Sag Harbor

Edwards served in the 2nd New York Volunteer Cavalry Regiment, known as "Harris Light Cavalry."

Henry was killed in action, on November 22, 1864, at the Battle of Mt. Jackson, Shenandoah Valley, VA.

He is buried in Oakland Cemetery, Sag Harbor.

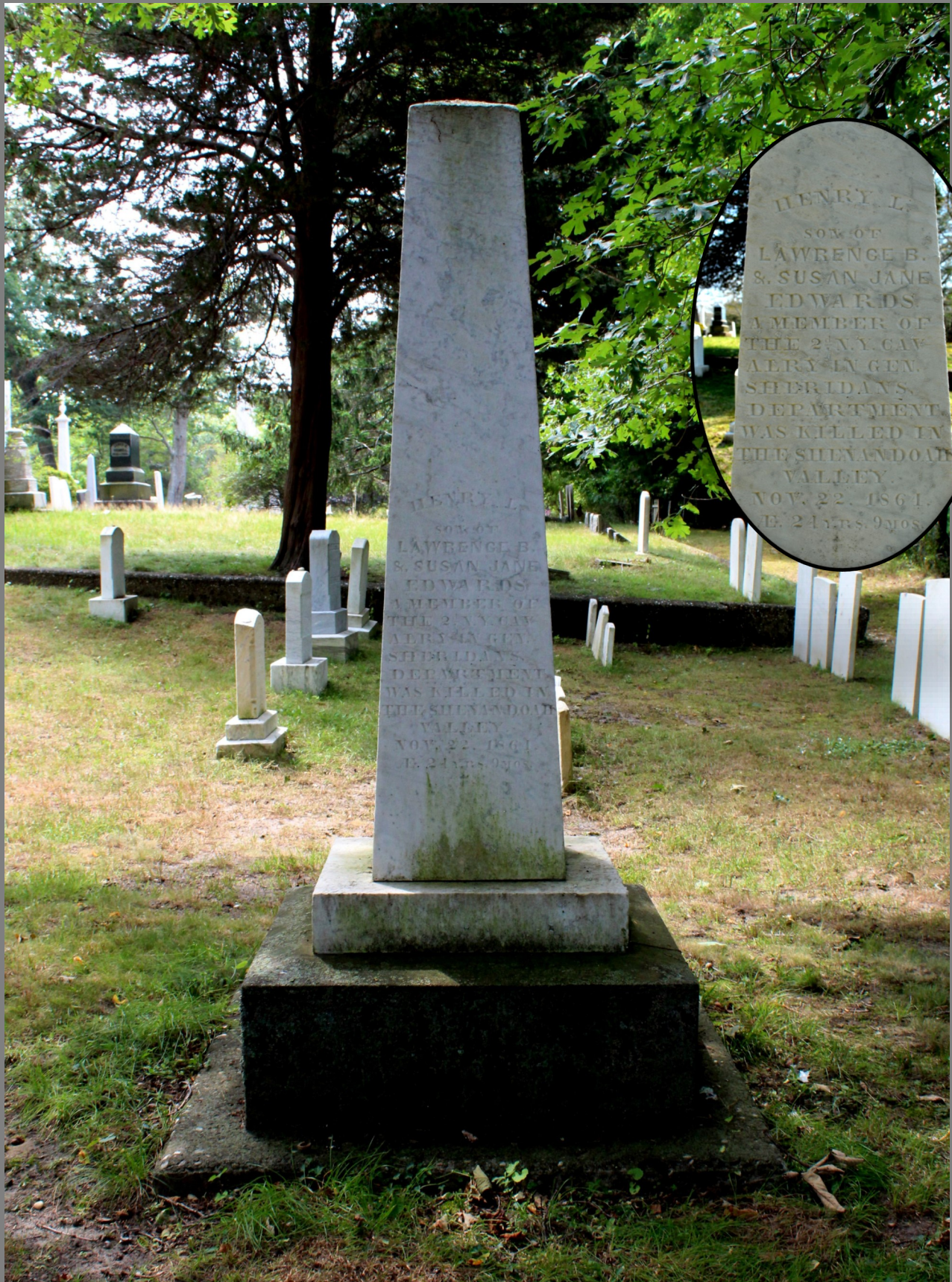
JOSEPH.—At East Hampton, 5th inst., Vincent Joseph, æ 29 years.

CLARK.—At Southampton, 6th inst., Mrs. Cordelia F. Clark, æ 40 years, 6 m, 22 days.

PATTERSON.—At Bridge Hampton, 3d inst., of diptheria, Mary A. wife of Egbert Patterson, 34 years, 8 m, 22 days. 5th, of diptheria, a child of Egbert Patterson, æ 1 year, 8 m.

MULFORD.—At Andersonville, Ga, (Rebel Stockade Prison) July 7th, Sergeant Wm. R. Mulford, 23d Illinois Volunteers, only son of Wm. R. Mulford, Esq., of this village, in the 32d year of his age.

EDWARDS.—On the battle field, in the Shannandoah Valley, Henry L. Edwards, of this village, aged about 25 years.
