Hometown: Quogue.

Hallock served in the 11th New York Volunteer Cavalry, known as "Scott's 900," in Company K.

On January 13, 1862, at the age of 31, he mustered in with the rank of 1st Lieutenant and was later promoted to the rank of Captain.

Hallock was wounded and died on May 17, 1864, at the St. James U.S. Army General Hospital, New Orleans, LA.

Capt. Hallock is memorialized on the Civil War Monument in the Westhampton Cemetery.

Obituary.

The following Obituary notice of Capt. FRANKLIN B. HALLECK, was sent us from Thibodaux, La., on the death of our deceased friend.—Ed.

Captain F. B. HALLECK of Company E, 11th New York (Scott's 900) Cavalry died in New Orleans on the 17th inst., from a gun shot wound, received on the banks of New River soon after his company was assigned to duty at Donaldsonville.

It is painful under any circumstances to see our comrades fall by our sides even in battle and in the moments of victory. Captain Halleck fell at the head of his detachment; there was no foe in sight; there was no organized force of the enemy in the vicinity. Yet there was over the river, secure from Capt. Halleck and his band of heroes, hidden in a cane-brake, a band of armed desperadoes, guerrillas and murderers, who from their place of safety fired upon the advance guard of the detachment, and at the second discharge Capt. Halleck fell mortally wounded, struck by a buck shot in the back of his head. The skill of the medical profession, in vain exerted, failed to extract the ball, and after lingering a number of weeks, on the 17th ult., he closed a life of usefulness and great promise.

Capt. HALLECK was a native of Southampton, in the State of New York. He entered the service as First Lieutenant of Company E. soon after the organization of this Regiment. For a long time the commanding officer of the company,—by his ability, by the faithful discharge of all his duties, by his unwavering firmness and his gentlemanly conduct, he won the regard and confidence of every member of his company. Subsequently he was promoted to a Captancy and transferred to Company K. which he commanded when he fell at the head of his column.

A truer patriot and a braver man never fell in the service of his country. A member of a wealthy and influential family, he could have remained at home and enjoyed the ease and comfort which were at his command; but patriotism and duty called him to the field, and he obeyed the summons. The writer of these lines, who feels called upon to pay this last tribute to the gallant and lamented dead, has probably been longer and more intimately acquainted with Captain Halleck than have his other comrades in arms; to some extent he shared with him the same anxieties and discouragements in the company he was instrumental in organizing (Company E.) Yet he never knew him to falter or hesitate, but he was always ready to discharge all the duties which devolved upon him as a soldier and an officer.

The family of Captain HALLECK, to whom the sad intelligence of his death will ere long be conveyed, may be comforted by the

assurance that all that medical skill, all that kindness, all that friendly care could do, was done for their departed relative and friend. To them it was not permitted to watch by him in his last moments, to alleviate his sufferings and smoothen his pathway to the grave. Yet he was surrounded by kind and sympathizing friends.
