Albert Asbury Halsey

Hometown: Bridgehampton.

Halsey served in the 127th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment, known as the "Monitors," in Company K.

On September 8, 1862, at the age of 22, he mustered in with the rank of Private and was later promoted to the rank of Sergeant.

Halsey mustered out with his company on June 30, 1865, at Charleston, S.C. He is buried in Edgewood Cemetery, Bridgehampton.

A. Asbury Halsey, 83, native and life long resident of Bridgehampton, died at the home of a daughter, in Water Mill, January 19. He served with Co. K., 127th Regt. N. Y. Vols., during the Civil war. Two sons, C. A. Halsey and Arthur G. Halsey of Bridgehampton, and two daughters, Miss Ada Halsey of Bridgehampton, and Mrs. John Dayton of East Hampton, survive him. Burial at Bridgehampton Saturday.
