Silas Edmond Halsey

Hometown: Water Mill.

Halsey served in the 127th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment, known as the "Monitors," in Company K.

On September 8, 1862, at the age of 21, he mustered in with the rank of Private. Halsey was killed in action on December 9, 1864, during Sherman's March to the Sea, in the Battle of Tulifinny at Deveaux's Neck, S.C.

He is buried in the Water Mill Cemetery.

In the battle of Duvcaux's Neck, on the 9th, the following casualties occurred in the 127th Regiment, from this place and vicinity. Silas Halsey of Bridge Hampton, Henry A. Skidmore of Good Ground, and Chas L. Brown, killed; and among the wounded, 1st Serg't Edward T. Nicoll, of this place, in the foot. severely, Stephen H Crowell, of this village, in the thigh severely, and Corporal Peter Whittle, in both legs; and Corporal Terry of River Head, and Geo. W. Corwin. Col Gurney was wounded on the 6th inst.
