Hometown: Sag Harbor

Jessup served in the 48th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment, known as "Continental Guard," in Company G.

In August 1861, at the age of 26, he mustered in with the rank of Private and was later promoted to the rank of Corporal.

He was wounded in action, May 10, 1864, at the Battle of Chester Station, Chester Hill, VA. He was then captured at the Battle of Cold Harbor, VA.

He was released and mustered out with his company September 1865, at Raleigh, N.C.
