Whitney served in the 6th New York Volunteer Cavalry Regiment, known as the "2nd Ira Harris Guard," in Company F.

It is unknown when he mustered in but he re-enlisted in December 16, 1863.

Whitney is buried in Oakland Cemetery, Sag Harbor.

SUDDEN DEATH — Charles L. Whitney of this village died suddenly on Wednesday morning from heart failure. He was attacked with severe pains about the heart early Tuesday morning followed by great exhaustion. Medical aid was summoned, and he was partially relieved. He slept well Tuesday night, but on Wednesday morning while sitting upon the side of his bed he fell into a reclining position and immediately died. He was formerly a Street Commissioner of this village, but of recent years has been an operative in the Watch Case Factory. Mr. Whitney was a veteran of the late war, and belonged to the 6th N. Y. Cavalry. His funeral will be tomorrow afternoon by Edwin Rose Post G. A. R. of which he was a member.
