Squires served in the 81st New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment, known as the “Mohawk Rangers.”

In October 1861, at the age of 19, he mustered in with the rank of Private and was later promoted to the rank of 1st Lieutenant.

Squires is buried in Oakland Cemetery, Sag Harbor.

Henry Squires and Anna Bebler Squires, his wife, formerly of Bridgehampton, died within a few days of each other, Oct. 2 and Oct. 5. Mr. Squires was a veteran of the Civil war, enlisting at the age of 19. He had been a member of Wamponamton Lodge, No. 437, F. & A. M., fifty-five years, and was, at the time of his death, the oldest member in length of service. The funeral, Sunday, was largely attended by the Masonic fraternity, under whose ritual the ceremonies were conducted. Mrs. Squires was the daughter of the late John Bebler of Sag Harbor.—News
