Meeting started at 7:00 with a list of positives happening in Hampton Bays and what was seen as needed improvement.

Code Enforcement was listed as number one improvement needed and Gail Shepard was asked to write a letter to Ryan Murphy, the Public Safety Emergency Management Administrator, inviting him to a meeting in the future. Rick Martel stated he is hoping to add more Code Enforcement officers to the upcoming Budget.

Vehicle speed and the lack of stopping at Stop Signs was also a priority for Police Enforcement. Rick Martel stated he is hoping to add additional Police to next year's Budget.

The Belaire site was discussed in full by Rick Martel. The Trustees are in agreement to repair their road, now used by Station Bar as additional parking, by adding crushed shells/small stone to the driveway and adding a kayak ramp. The dredging of the water of Penny Pond, which is contaminated by the poor septic on the Belaire property, is being discussed by Southampton Town and its funding.. The subdivision of the property between CPF seawall and the remainder of the property owned by Southampton is being explored. Rick feels a new public hearing may be needed as the immediate neighborhood and general consensus does not want a Park, but more natural open space. There is already dumping over the high fence, which is a concern.

Christine informed us of Chamber of Commerce activities.

The meeting ended at 8Pm.
