Garbage cans in town have been taken away. This will be addressed.

A discussion on the status of the sidewalks. The Highway Division has no more funding this year.

A discussion about fire access to construction sites.

Deer Population/ hunting on CPF lands. Cydni is working with CPF on a hunting plan but it will not be ready for the fall.

Situation on the Group Home on Ponquogue where a resident brutally attacked someone last week, necessitating a school lockdown when the resident could not be located after the Victim was found and airlifted, and the long-standing Homeless Population in Hampton Bays.

The homeless problem continues to be an issue. Rick is working on a loitering law and the Town has opened up Good Ground Park at night for police surveillance.

Cell Tower- plans were approved and signed but a building permit has not been applied for. The Town does get a donation from Optimum but Verizon is not precluded from servicing Southampton.

4-way stop signs at Ponquogue and Bay Avenues. The Town will review this again. The Town has deployed speed monitors which have been effective.

Penny Pond Park- CPF is working on this.

Post Office Parking Lot- this is planned for the fall.

The HB CAC needs to expand its numbers. Members are asked to solicit new members.

Code Enforcement is working after hours.

Sewerage Treatment Plant is moving forward. The timeline is about 2 years.
