*Arrived at Vichy, France March 12, 1918, with
 35 Physicians, 65 nurses and 150, Enlisted
 U. S. Soldiers. The first of the U. S. Army
 to arrive in Vichy. Soon Army Base
 Hospital was organized. Some French
 wounded soldiers were received. Then
 American sick gassed and wounded.
 At date of Armistice Nov. 11. Hospital Centre
 comprised 33,000 patients. Left Vichy
 for Port of Embarkation on Mar 5, 1919, Arrived
 La Baule France Mar 8, 1919, Left La Baule
 Mar. 17 for Camp Kerhuon Brest, arrived 17th
 Left Brest Apr. 6 for U. S. A. on S. S. Kaiserin Aug.
 Victoria. Arrived Hoboken, N. Y. Apr. 18, 1919*
