Sick in Hospital Châtillon-sur-Seine July 1st July 21st Joined Regiment at Abbeville July 21st
Fifth Range Aug 5th Aug 10th Back to Abbeville Trained for Hindenburg Summit
"Ternamentel" Went up Sept 27th Went on Sept 29th Landed 27th Div. Signal Detail
Came out about Oct 10th Brought detail transport back to "Corbie". Arrived at
"Gleay" near Amiens about Oct 15th Rest area. Was here when Armistice was
Signed. Drove back in lines on Nov 10th. Nice to miss it. Had 2000 day leave
to Dinard and St. Malo. Cote D'Emeraude. Rejoined outfit at "Comme" Le Mans rest
area. Had 7 hr. Shipped from Brest March 1st. Arrived N.Y. Harbor March 10th
Camp Merritt N.Y. (P.S. Shipped on from Camp Merritt) 27th Div. Trench March 25th
Camp Upton March 29th Discharged Camp Upton April 2nd Thank Godfrey*
