A member of the American Legion since its organized, my first experience of War fare was at Baccarak Sect. July 15, but I found out that this first experience wasnt as quite exciting as the later one, August 1, 1918. Kiese Sect. August 18, 1918. Arrive Airne off Aug 18 Sept 16 1918 (Meuse Agonne) where a Battalion of my 71 Div. was ~~surrounded~~ by the Germans and we had to stop firing until we could get in communication with the said it was mighty hard for the Germans to do anything funny when the U.S. boys came in contact with them, I was at the front until Nov, 11, 1918.
