I am answering your letter in regards to my time in service etc. I feel that I should not do this as I saw no service of any kind. I enlisted in the Motor Corps at west 55th street New York about September 15th 1918. You see I am not quite sure of the dates. Well anyway papers came to Riverhead telling them to send me to Camp Johnson, Jacksonville Florida. And through some mistake in those papers I was held back. I then came to New York to find out about it and they said that the local board at Riverhead should have sent me.

It was not until soon before
Armistice day that I received
another notice to go right away.

I had my papers to the camp
even my railroad tickets, when
they received word to send no
more men to camps. That is
all I can tell you, although I
imagine that they have a complete
record at Riverhead.
